- Papers are not published or accepted for publication at the point of submission.
- Papers must be primarily authored by student(s). If the manuscript is co-authored with a faculty member, a letter from the other author(s) is required to verify that the student applicant had the primary responsibility for the work.
- Papers authored by Ph.D., Master's and Undergraduate student(s) are welcome.
- Student papers for PAS 2024 Annual Meeting are also welcome, if they meet the eligibility requirements.
