Singapore's Population in 2022 - Unpacked

According to the Population in Brief 2022 report that was released on 27th September, Singapore's resident population recorded a 3.4% recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic-affected 2021 level, standing at 5.64 million as at end June 2022. Marriages, births and immigration trends reported in the Population in Brief report also showed the impact of the pandemic, with more marriages, births and immigration than in the previous year, but still lower than 2019. Singapore's population ageing continues apace, with the report indicating larger cohorts of baby boomers beginning to enter the 65 year age group and above.

Join this online discussion session organised by the Population Association of Singapore with three speakers who will help unpack these demographic trends of ageing, marriage and fertility and immigration. They will consider: What does population ageing actually mean for Singaporeans in the next decade, and what steps should we be taking to prepare for this? What are the prospects for a sustained rebound in marriages and fertility, and what policies should we consider to support this trend? How does immigration affect the trend in population ageing and other socio-economic factors?

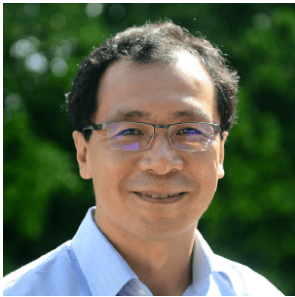
